

MOTION TO RECOMMIT H.R. 2857

Mr. Kuhl of New York moves to recommit the bill H.R. 2857 to the Committee on Education and Labor with instructions to report the same back to the House promptly with the following amendments:

Page 123, line 10, strike the quotation marks and period.

Page 123, after line 10, insert the following new section:

1 **“SEC. 189D. CRIMINAL HISTORY CHECKS.**

2 “(a) IN GENERAL.—Entities selecting individuals to
3 serve in a position in which the individual receives a Cor-
4 poration grant-funded living allowance, stipend, education
5 award, salary, or other remuneration in a program receiv-
6 ing assistance under the national service laws, shall, sub-
7 ject to regulations and requirements established by the
8 Corporation, conduct criminal history checks for such indi-
9 viduals.

10 “(b) REQUIREMENTS.—A criminal history check
11 shall, except in cases approved for good cause by the Cor-
12 poration, include a name-based search of the Department
13 of Justice National Sex Offender Public Registry and—

1 “(1) a search of the State criminal registry or
2 repository in the State in which the program is oper-
3 ating and the State in which the individual resides
4 at the time of application; or

5 “(2) a Federal Bureau of Investigation finger-
6 print check.

7 “(c) ELIGIBILITY PROHIBITION.—An individual shall
8 be ineligible to serve in a position described under sub-
9 section (a) if such individual—

10 “(1) refuses to consent to the criminal history
11 check described in subsection (b);

12 “(2) makes a false statement in connection with
13 such criminal history check;

14 “(3) is registered, or is required to be reg-
15 istered, on a State sex offender registry or the na-
16 tional sex offender registry established under the
17 Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of
18 2006 (42 U.S.C. 16901 et seq.); or

19 “(4) has been convicted of murder, as described
20 in section 1111 of title 18, United States Code.”.
